



POST ROCK DISTRICT 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS ARCHERY QUALIFIER

July 27, 2025 at 8:00 AM

Glen Elder State Park

South of US-24 and KS 128

(Across the road from the park office)

Post Rock District 4-H Shooting Sports will be hosting a shooting sports match for archery. This match is a state qualifier. Kansas 4-H members actively enrolled in the project and discipline are eligible. If they are 9-18 years old before January 1 of the current year. 9 is the minimum age to participate at a Kansas 4-H state match. All levels of shooters are welcome!

This is a FITA state qualifying match. Juniors (9-13 yrs. old 4-H age) will shoot 12 arrows at 30 meters and 12 arrows at 20 meters. Seniors (14-18 yrs. old 4-H age) will shoot 12 arrows at 40 meters and 12 arrows at 30 meters. To qualify for the Kansas 4-H State Match in archery the minimum individual scores are:

Recurve - 120 points of a possible 240;

Olympic - 140 points of a possible 240;

Bow Hunter/Compound - 200 points of a possible 240; and

Open/Compound - 210 points of a possible 240.

Please refer to the 2025 Kansas State 4-H Match Rules for competition guidelines.

Registration form must be completed before participation will be allowed. Registration fee is \$15 per participant, due at the event. Make the check payable to Jewell County 4-H Council.

Registration form is preferred to be received via mail or email by July 18. The qualifying match check-in will begin at 7:30 AM, and the match will begin at 8:00 AM. Each county needs to verify their shooters' information for accuracy at check-in. There are no awards beyond qualifying for the state match.

The range is across the road from the park office. Park permit will be required and can be obtained at the park office. There is no concessions at the qualifier. There will be a designated space to put up a canopy tent for spectators.
