

Decatur County 4-H Shotgun State Qualifier

Decatur County 4-H Shooting Sports is hosting a state qualifying event for <u>**Trap</u>** on August 10, 2025 at the Oberlin Gun Club, approximately 1 mile East of Oberlin on HWY 36 (North side of highway)</u>

Event fee will be \$20.00 per shooter. Minimum age to participate is 10 years old as of January 1, 2025. Registration will start at 8 a.m. CST with the match to start at 9 a.m. CST. <u>Concession will be available</u>. Squads will be assigned a time and either East or West Trap.

Shooters will compete in 2 rounds of 25 from the 16 yard line. Both rounds will be shot consecutively and on the same trap with a long enough break in between rounds to grab another box of shells. State qualifying score will be 35 hits out of 50. Shoot offs will start at the 21 yard line and move back 2 yards at a time per round until a winner is decided. Shoot offs will be held after the last squad has shot. Current ATA and 2025 Kansas State Match Rules apply.

Awards will be given to the top 3 shooters in each division based on the qualifying course of fire. Divisions will be as follows:

Junior Division (age 10-13) as of January 1, 2025

Senior Division (age 14-18) as of January 1, 2025

Shooters will need to bring equipment and shells, NO RELOADS. Ammunition must be new shells, no larger than 12 gauge, with a minimum shot size of 7 ½ shot and max shot charge of 1 1/8 oz. Eye and ear protection is required for anyone past the ready fire line. No barrels resting on toes, foot, or painted at any part of the body. A shell catcher is recommended on semi-auto shotguns. **ALL** spectators are to remain behind the white ribbon fence.

Entry forms are due by August 1, 2025. Fees can be paid the day of competition. For more information contact Brent Stallman at 785-470-1248.
